We understand that training in some areas of responsibility will be required.

We are looking for a self-motivated, driven individual that is not afraid of a challenge and ready to learn new skills and take on those challenges. ECCID is a small Irrigation District with a low level of employee turnover and a high level of employee satisfaction. This position participates in the repair, maintenance and servicing of District vehicles, heavy equipment, and all rotating and mechanical equipment. Perform skilled and complex mechanical maintenance, repair, fabrication, machining, construction as required. Participate in a preventative maintenance program; and to perform other field related maintenance, repair and constructing related duties as assigned.

This is a full-time position within the Maintenance Section of the District.

Other Benefits Include: Medical, Dental, Vision, Life Insurance, and CalPERS Retirement

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Coordinate repairs with operations and maintenance personnel related to the diagnosis and scheduling of mechanical difficulties with District automobiles, trucks and heavy equipment and District facilities.
- Participate in the operation, repair, maintenance, and upkeep of the Districts pump stations, buildings, water delivery systems and related facilities.
- Diagnose malfunctions and determine effective course of action for correcting them.
- Inspect heavy trucks for compliance with California Highway Patrol (CHP) Biennial Inspection of Terminals, (BIT) inspections.
- Ensure all District equipment is in CARB compliance and participate in the administration of the CARB program.
- Road test vehicles and equipment for diagnostic and repair purposes.
- Perform fabrication, welding, and machining of various types for use on vehicles and District facilities.
- Rebuild gearboxes, engines, pumps, and other mechanical equipment.
- Perform application of high-performance coating systems on equipment.
- Maintain shop cleanliness; repair shop equipment as necessary.

- Maintain complete records of condition of equipment, repairs performed, and maintenance costs.
- Provide accurate budgetary estimates to management for annual budget.
- Maintain warehouse inventory of critical materials.
- Operate District heavy equipment.
- Perform/ assist with maintenance projects and construction as needed throughout the District.
- Operating and maintaining a variety of hand and power tools used in maintenance and construction work including heavy equipment.
- Perform confined space entries per District and Cal OSHA regulations.
- Fill in as a back up to deliver water to customers on an as needed basis.
- Responds to emergency calls in off-hours as required.

Preferred qualifications/experience include:

This is a single journey level class in which incumbents perform activities which ensure the District's fleet and mechanical equipment are maintained and repaired to District standards. The position requires a strong mechanical aptitude and the use of initiative, resourcefulness, and considerable independent judgment. This class is expected to work with minimal supervision and possess the ability to provide functional and technical lead direction over assigned personnel when required. This position also functions at the capacity of an advanced journey level maintenance worker when required.

EXPERIENCE

Five years of responsible experience performing work as a mechanic working on automotive, heavy equipment and/or industrial equipment. One year providing supervision or serving in a lead worker capacity desirable.

EDUCATION

Equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade. Significant relevant work experience may be substituted for some education requirements at the discretion of the District.

LICENSES

A California Class-A commercial driver's license and appropriate endorsements is required within six months of appointment and must be maintained as a condition of employment.
